- 5. Reports:
 - a. K 8 Math and Reading AIS Jason Chevrier and James Derby explained to the board what AIS (Academic Intervention Services) are and how students qualify to receive the services. In addition to the students that qualify using State Standards, teachers recommend students based on their classroom observations. They talked about the various methods of intervention available to students. There was talk about more intervention at grades K 3 hoping to lower the number of AIS in higher grades.
 - b. HS Math results (SAT and fourth year participation) Ron Agostinoni presented on SAT scores received by Schodack students. The scores for the last four years have been consistent and has remained in the high 1500's. He showed a comparison to larger districts in the Capital Region area as well as to other schools in our BOCES. He explained the results of Regents examinations for Algebra, Geometry and Algebra2/Trigonometry and the possible reasons for the changes in the scores from year to year.
- 6. Meeting open for Public discussion: Tim Ryan talked briefly about a program the district will be participating in beginning December 9, 2013 to teach about Computer Sciences and Computer Programing not just for computers but for Smartphones.
- 7. Board Discussion: There was brief discussion about where the United States ranks in education against other Countries. There was discussion about a business incubator (Smartkids) that will involve third grade students. There was discussion about where the district stands with the potential capital project and what
