4Minute is a South Korean girl group formed under Cube Entertainment in 2009. The group consists of members Nam Ji-hyun, Heo Ga-yoon, Jeon Ji-yoon, Kim Hyun-a, and Kwon So-hyun. 4minute is known for its edgy dance-pop style and “girl crush” image in which attracted a large female fan base.

The group officially debuted in June of 2009 with their single “Hot Issue”. Over the years the group has released one full-length Japanese album, *Diamond*(2010), one full-length Korean album, *4Minutes Left*(2011), seven Korean extended plays, and multiple singles. However, the group

disbanded in June of 2016



with an unsuccessful contract renewal with the Cube Entertainment. They were able to release one more final mini-album called *Act. 7* with lead single “Hate” which was a collaboration with American producer *Skrillex*. 4Minute was able to leave a legacy behind with receiving many major awards since debut.
