PROJECT OBJECTIVE:

Obtain the Girl Scout Gold Award by successfully completing the research, planning, fund raising, acquisition and construction of one set of bleachers for the Maple Hill High School Track Area.

PROJECT RATIONALE:

I chose this project because there are no dedicated bleachers for the track area at Maple Hill High School and my passion is the sport of running. My goal was to purchase one set of bleachers for the track area before the start of my senior year track season (Spring 2021).

My project addresses the need of safe seating for spectators to watch organized Track & Field and other school athletic events. Because of this issue, many people are not able to attend events at the track. Parents, friends, the elderly and those with disabilities have nowhere to sit and watch their grandchildren, children and loved ones participating in the Track & Field events.

Grandparents, parents, families, friends, teachers and the community as a whole will benefit from this project. I truly and passionately wanted people to be able to share in these events with their loved ones as I love running and I wanted to solve this issue for generations to come.

The purpose of this article is to document my Gold Award Project in hopes that others will be inspired to get involved and perform similar projects in their towns.

PROJECT EXECUTION:

FUND RAISING: The research and planning for this project began in March of 2020. I have been working on raising the funds to purchase the bleachers since June 2020 by creating original artwork and selling it at the **Castleton Artisans Market**. I started a bottle and can drive in July 2020 and was also performing odd jobs like weeding gardens, house sitting and taking care of people's pets to earn the money necessary for this project.

Raising money during the Covid-19 Pandemic was not easy. With the support of the community, I exceeded my original goal to purchase one set of bleachers and I am proud to say that I was able to purchase two sets of bleachers for Maple Hill High School Track. There was even some money left over to buy equipment for the Maple Hill Cross-Country team. *Did I mention my love of running?*

Our community has been so helpful in pitching in with the bottle and can drive. The Bottle and Cans Drive was facilitated by the **East Greenbush Bottle & Can Company.** I shout out an enormous thanks to them. Also I send a special thank you to **The Capital Sawmill** who supplied the wood for all the major works of art I produced which has been a crucial part of this project.

PURCHASE, DELIVERY AND INSTALLATION: Mr. Matt LaClair, Director of Facilities at Maple Hill High School is my adviser for this Project, and he has been a huge help. Mr. LaClair was there every step of the way on this journey. Starting with taking on the role as my advisor, making the initial contact with the company where I purchased the bleachers from, coordinating delivery of

the bleachers to the school and finally being a part of the team who assembled the bleachers. I cannot be more thankful for all the help he and his team have given me. After Mr. LaClair provided the information on which vendors work with the school district it was then up to me to research vendors, receive quotes, understand bleacher types and delivery options and then choose a bleacher for purchase with the associated cost that fit my budget.

The funds were tallied up, we agreed on an option and then ordered the bleachers taking into consideration that deliveries scheduled during Covid-19 are often delayed. The bleachers were delivered in March. They were assembled and installed at the track on April 18, 2021, which met my goal of having them in place for this track season.
