# Save Planning Requirements

- The school district is required to maintain a District Wide Safety Plan implemented by the District Wide Safety Team.
- Each building maintains a Building Level Emergency Response Plan and a Building Level Safety Team.
- The plans must be updated each year to address changes in roles and responsibilities or significant changes in security procedures.



### DISTRICT WIDE PLAN

- The District-Wide Plan is a **public document** that is really a philosophical statement which addresses the school's approach to preventing violence from a district-wide perspective.
- Consists of Four Main Sections:
  - Section I: Introduction
  - Section II: Risk Reduction, Prevention, and Intervention
  - Section III: Response
  - Section IV: Recovery
  - Appendices



# Section I - Introduction

- Designation of the Chief Emergency Officer
- Appointment of the District Wide School Safety Team
- District Information
- District Wide School Safety Plan Review and Public Comment
- Philosophy and Goals
- District Policy Manual



# Section II - Risk Reductions, Prevention, and Intervention

- Prevention and Intervention Strategies
- Early Detection of Potentially Violent Behaviors
- Hazard Identification



# **SECTION III - RESPONSE**

- Notification and Activation (Internal and External)
- Emergency Response Protocols
  - Shelter/Shelter-in-Place
  - Hold-in-Place
  - Evacuation
  - Secure Lockout
  - Lockdown



### Section IV - Recovery

- Address the need for all involved to heal and to restore the school community to "normal" operations.
- District Wide Plan supports each School Building Plan by deploying District resources to support:
  - Building-Level Emergency Response Team
  - Post-Incident Response Team
- Debriefing of Incident Is essential to help evaluate the District's plan for possible revisions
